The Court is informed of the contagious nature of the COVID-19 virus. It is the Court's desire that the court remain open and that day-to-day criminal hearings be conducted, and be conducted as safely as possible.

Persons arrested for federal offenses and those detained pending further proceedings are primarily held in Muscatine County, Polk County and Pottawattamie County jails. Each of these facilities currently has or is in the process of finalizing capability to interact with the federal court by videoconference. Conducting hearings by videoconference will protect judicial officers and their staffs, the Marshals Service, prosecutors, defense lawyers, interpreters, probation officers, the defendants, jail populations and others. Videoconferencing has been used successfully in this court for initial appearances and arraignments conducted on short notice or at remote locations. The Court has enhanced the capability of videoconferencing by including a method for secure communication between the defense lawyer and the defendant during these conferences. Accordingly, the Court has taken every step reasonably possible to ensure that the defendant receives the same experience by videoconference that he or she would receive by attending in the courtroom.


Accordingly, effective immediately, all initial appearances, arraignments, detention and other bond hearings shall, to the greatest extent possible, be conducted with any in-custody defendant appearing by videoconference from the Muscatine, Polk or Pottawattamie County jails. These hearings shall be held by videoconference, even over the objection of the defendant.
